Craving for nature? Several hiking trails await you! Please check on our website to discover them all.

The Eel trail will lead you to the heart of a protected area, between marsh and forest. You will see storks and horses of Camargue.

The Ancient Lighthouse trail will impress you with its magnificent views of the Seine estuary, the Château de la Pommeraye, the Carbec chapel, and of course the former 19th century lighthouse.

For a walk in the forest, in the cool, we recommend the Bois du Breu A superb walk with family, on foot, by bike or with the stroller.

The Valley of La Claire trail will have you discover magical corners, such as a small waterfall, a wash house, and a view of Honfleur.

Grab your bike and cycle the routes around Honfleur. Five bike trails (from 10 to 21 miles) are ready for you. Two long routes (the Seine à Vélo and the Vélomaritime) also pass near Honfleur.

The Garden of Celebrities introduces a park of 10 hectares hosting about twenty garden boats in the center of which stand the busts of

On the menu, grey shrimp and scallops, true stars of the bay of Seine. The shrimp is eaten "à la locale": shelled, spread on a "brié style" bread roll (dense and soft crumb bread) and served with salted butter.

Another Norman star: the apple! Find it at our local producers, where it is declined in cider, pommel, calvados, and of course, in juice.


