

HONFLEUR

Honfleur enjoys a temperate climate making it an ideal place to visit at any time of the year. The town has preserved its rich artistic and historic heritage with its picturesque streets, traditional buildings, museums, churches and monuments.

L'ENCLOS

The oldest and most visited part of Honfleur lies within the area of the Vieux bassin, the St. Catherine promenade, the Lieutenance and the deconsecrated St. Etienne church. Behind the church lie the remains of the old prison and the original 17th century salt warehouses now used for exhibitions, conferences and concerts.

ST. CATHERINE

Surrounding this 15th and 16th century church you will discover narrow cobbled streets, art galleries, boutiques and traditional craft shops. The St. Catherine church was built by shipwrights and is the largest wooden church with a separate bell-tower in France. The bell-tower, also largely built of wood, dates from the end of the 15th century and is now a museum of religious art.

ST. LÉONARD

The façade of the church and the first bay of the nave date from the end of the 15th and the beginning of the 16th centuries. The flamboyantly carved main entrance supports a magnificent octagonal bell-tower constructed in 1760.

EUGÈNE BOUDIN MUSEUM

Located in a 19th century chapel and two modern extensions, with views over Honfleur and the Seine river, the museum named after Honfleur's most famous painter houses some 1.200 square metres of permanent exhibitions in nine rooms.

The museum displays and preserves more than 2.500 paintings, sculptures, drawings or engravings, 700 photographs on glass plates from the 1880's-1920's, more than 1.000 objects, headdresses, costumes, and furniture, a collection of more than 100 tourist posters and old toys from the 19th and 20th centuries.

From the Katia Granoff room on the third floor, you can admire the changing skies of the estuary and Eugène Boudin's "merveilleux nuages".

MAISONS SATIE

Maisons Satie is a musical and visual tribute to the composer Erik Satie, who was born in Honfleur in 1866.

As an accomplished early 20th century musician, Erik Satie worked with the greatest artists of his time: Braque, Cocteau, Picabia, Picasso; and inspired such famous composers as Debussy, Ravel and Stravinsky.

Using headphones (English available) you are guided from room to room to the sound of Erik Satie's music.



The accompanying commentary is presented against a background of the sounds of his extraordinary daily life.

A blend of sound, light, images and objects takes you into Satie's world of humour and fantasy. More than just an exhibition, Les Maisons Satie is a vibrant experience revealing the man, his music and his time.

ETHNOGRAPHY MUSEUM

Located in Honfleur's old prison and in houses from the 16th century, this museum re-creates life in old Normandy. In its nine rooms you will find traditional furniture, costumes and household objects as seen in typical Normandy homes of the 18th and 19th centuries.



MARITIME MUSEUM

Located on the Vieux Bassin, in Honfleur's oldest church St. Etienne (14th and 15th centuries), the museum houses an important collection of model ships, carvings, engravings, plans and other maritime memorabilia, all evoking Honfleur's sea-faring history.

THE PUBLIC PARK "JARDIN RETROUVÉ"

Situated between the seawalls and the Boulevard Charles V you will find the "Jardin Retrouvé" an attractive garden providing a quiet place to relax. There is also a separate play area for children.

THE PARK "JARDIN DU TRIPOT"

Opened in 2013, this unique garden is an invitation to stroll, a haven of tranquility in the heart of the historic centre of Honfleur. During the renovation, remains of old tanneries have been discovered.

The artist Annick Leroy made a mural mosaic recalling the work of the guild of tanners and dyers, two fountains and a giant snail sculpture covered with mosaic.

THE PARK "JARDIN DES PERSONNALITÉS"

Along the jetty, this garden has been created, featuring celebrities who were born, lived or worked in Honfleur. They include the painter Claude Monet, the musician Erik Satie or the writers Charles Baudelaire and Alphonse Allais. A pleasant leisurely way to discover Honfleur's heritage.

THE BEACH

The city was classified "Sea Resort" and the "Pavillon Bleu" label has been given since 2010. Located at the end of the town on the coast road to Trouville, this pleasant beach is equipped in the summer with beach huts, showers, a paddling pool and games for children. Lifeguards are on duty during the summer season, from July 1st to August 31st. Fast food in the summer season

CÔTE DE GRÂCE AND MONT-JOLI

From the Côte de Grâce, 1.5 km from the town centre, there are spectacular views of the Seine estuary. Nearby is one of the region's oldest sanctuary chapels, Notre-Dame de Grâce, founded by Richard II and rebuilt from 1600 to 1615.

The Mont-Joli offers a magnificent view of Honfleur, the Normandy Bridge and the Seine valley.

NATUROSPACE

This is the largest tropical butterfly house in France. Kept at a constant temperature of 28°C, thousands of butterflies put on an extra-ordinary display competing with the most exotic of flowers.

They fly all around you as you walk in the tropical gardens which feature orchids, bougainvilleas, pineapples, birds of paradise and palm trees. At the entrance is a hatchery where you can watch butterflies emerging from the chrysalis and slowly unfurling their wings.

Only 5 kilometers from Honfleur, go off to explore a rural and maritime territory, from *Berville-sur-Mer* to *Saint-Sulpice de Grimbouville*, passing by *Beuzeville* with its beautiful St. Hélier church. The landscape within the heart of the Estuary will delight you.

Vasouy (12th century church). *Pennedepie* (12th century church, wanderings in the Bois de Breuil, cider producers). *Cricqueboeuf* (12th century St. Martin church).

TOWARDS THE NORMANDY BRIDGE

La Rivière Saint-Sauveur, well known for its quality fruit production.

ON THE INLAND ROAD TO DEAUVILLE

Équemauville (charming village overlooking Honfleur). *Barneville-la-Bertran* (moated 17th and 18th centuries château - closed to the public) and church.

COUNTRYSIDE SOUTH-EAST OF HONFLEUR

Ablon (18th century château - closed to the public, 15th century St. Pierre church). *Gonneville-sur-Honfleur* (13th century church - closed to the public). *Fourneville* (12th and 13th centuries church). *Le Theil-en-Auge* (14th and 15th centuries church). *Genneville* (12th century church). *Quetteville* (parts of church dating from 11th century).
